But let's journey back to Pinckneyville, Illinois where the story of the preachers son, Paul Jr, and the young lady from the marching band, Marsha Keller, would begin their journey. And what a journey it has been. They attended church together and were voted at Pinckneyville High School as cutest couple. Answering the call of God for their lives they would head off to Pentecostal Bible Institute in Tupelo, Mississippi, Paul in 1964 and Marsha in 1965. Paul was editor of the Harvester yearbook, Student Body Vice President in 1965 and president in 1966, and sang with the PBI Quartet. They would graduate and ministry would include stints in Nashville, Tennessee, Schram City and Clinton, Illinois.

How many lives have been affected by this great couple? One such life from Schram City:

"He would play ball with all the kids then he would invite all the kids to church. He introduced me to Jesus Name baptism and the infilling of the Holy Ghost."
